## **Vision Statement**

We believe that all people are precious and honoured in God's sight. From this comes a desire for all in our care and in our partnerships to experience life in all its fullness, as promised by Jesus. We embrace the spiritual, physical, intellectual, emotional, moral, and social development of our young people.

## **Principles**

1. We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
2. We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
3. In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged
4. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
5. Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. It is our aim to ensure that all Pupil Premium children receive high quality, focused support and intervention throughout their time at Holy Trinity, regardless of ability.

## **Provision**

The range of provision the Governors may consider making for this group could include:

- Providing small group work with an experienced teacher.
- 1:1 or small-group support
- The provision of specific or specialist equipment
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through trained LSP's or external agencies
- The use of trips and external visitors to enhance educational and real-life experiences
- Opportunities to increase access to quality education
- Providing provision to pupils who require support emotionally so that they are prepared for learning.

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, moving children to at least age related expectations. Pupil premium resources will also be used to target higher attaining children eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant.

## **Reporting**

It will be the responsibility of the Head teacher, Deputy Head teacher or a delegated member of staff to produce regular reports for the Governors on:

1. The progress made towards narrowing the gap for socially disadvantaged pupils
2. An outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting

3. An evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress, made by the pupils receiving a particular provision

The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement to parents on how the Pupil Premium Grant has been used to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for socially disadvantaged pupils. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education.

### **Outcomes**

1. Children eligible for PPG will have greater chances available to them to enhance opportunities and attainment.
2. Children's enhanced opportunities will raise motivation and self-esteem
3. Attainment of socially disadvantaged children will be maximised
4. Accelerated progress of those children identified
5. Socially disadvantaged children will have greater opportunities to take a full part in the school's curriculum including educational visits
