

Instrument of Government

1. The name of the school is: Holy Trinity Church of England Primary School.
2. The school is a voluntary controlled school.
3. The name of the governing body is “Holy Trinity Church of England Primary”.
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - (a) 2 parent governors
 - (b) 1 local authority governor
 - (c) 1 Head Teacher
 - (d) 1 staff governor
 - (e) 2 foundation governors
 - (f) 4 co-opted governors
5. Total number of governors: 11.
6. Foundation governors shall be appointed as follows:

1 appointed by Lichfield Diocesan Board of Education.
7. (a) the holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio:

The Principal Officiating Minister of the Parish of West Bromwich Holy Trinity.
- (b) The Archdeacon of Walsall shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under

regulation 21 (1) of the Regulations, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which his/her governorship exists.

8. The Archdeacon of Walsall shall be entitled to request the removal of any ex officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute governor.
9. The School was founded as a church school on the 5th November 1842 by a Deed between George Sylvester and the Vicar and Churchwardens of the Parish West Bromwich Holy Trinity. Under the terms of a Conveyance of the 6th April 1977, following the transfer of the school to its present site, the Vicar and Churchwardens of the Parish of West Bromwich Holy Trinity were appointed as trustees.
10. Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.
11. This instrument of government comes into effect on 1st September 2017.
12. This instrument was made by order of The Borough Council of Sandwell on 7th July 2017.
13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the Lichfield Diocesan Board of Education.
